

Local brothers talked about the difficult situation prevailing in the church in connection with military operations, the sorrows and feelings experienced by Christians in these regions, as well as the special needs of people for food, water, clothing and medicines. Many people have lost everything, including housing. Winter is coming, and it is necessary to prepare coal for heating



church buildings and private houses; however, no one has the means to provide such a necessity.

The ministers from America brought monetary assistance, which was allocated from the churches of Bryte and *Emmanuel*, and agreed to further assist them in the future.


